Our mission centers every initiative we undertake – to empower sonographers to provide exceptional patient care through rigorous assessments and continual learning. The significance of every renewal or new membership is something that we honor each and every day.

Certification is a dynamic and evolving industry. Reflecting that, we continually strive to find innovative ways to add value and keep you in the loop on what is happening within our organization. With that, following is a snapshot of some of ARDMS' 2019 milestones:

- **Digital Badging** Underscoring how important our digital lives are, badges include what was awarded, the steps taken to earn it, skills tied to the earner's accomplishments, and links to additional information. To date, ARDMS has issued 441,708 badges. Badge earners are sharing their accomplishments on LinkedIn, Facebook, Twitter, and in their email signatures. - **Council Leadership Changeover** We extend our deepest appreciation to outgoing Chair **Karen Hoban, RDCS, RDMS, RVT**. Under her tenure, ARDMS benefitted tremendously by her collaborative style and boundless commitment. On that, we are pleased to announce that Tricia Turner, RDMS, RVT took the reins on January 1.
- Volunteerism To achieve all that we do, we rely on a committed group of volunteers, 162 to be exact. This group of subject matter experts wrote more than 797 items across all exams. As impressive, they have given more than 5,670 hours to advancing ARDMS' mission. If you hold active ARDMS certifications and want to volunteer and be involved, let us know by visiting the volunteer portal. One of our team members will get back with you to start your personalized onboarding effort.
- **Real Talk Sonography Video Series** This five-part video series captured the stories of more than 20 inspirational, aspirational, and compassionate professionals. If you missed any, you can watch them all here: https://www.ardms.org/discover-ardms/realtalksonography/.
- **Simulation Research** Our industry is shaped by innovation and these opportunities present us with a platform to engage our community, such as leveraging simulation to expedite sonography clinical mastery. Through this initiative, we have given sonographers, medical students, and residents in Columbus, OH and Oklahoma City and Tulsa, OK the opportunity to conduct simulated assessments of over 150 exam types. As important, this type of training allows for mistakes to be made and corrected without consequences to patients.
- RMSKS and RMSK Certifications Awarded ANSI/ISO Accreditation In April, we announced that the Registered in Musculoskeletal Sonographer® (RMSKS®) and Registered in Musculoskeletal® (RMSK®) sonography certifications were awarded accreditation by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) under the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) 17024 Standard for certifying bodies. The certifications raise the standards of musculoskeletal ultrasound worldwide and promote best practices for enhanced patient safety.
- *MSK/MSKS Item Idea App* The item idea submission mobile phone app is an alternate method for volunteers to submit item ideas and associated media pieces using a mobile device. Whereas our go-to submission platform, Pro!'s RIW (remote item writing) portal, has more stringent item reference and style guide rules enforced on the front end the item idea app that we've piloted this year with the MSK and MSKS groups aims to make it easier for item writers to submit full items or partial item ideas by removing some of barriers that have hampered writers' efforts in the past.
- *ARDMS Gives Back* Throughout the year, our team collected clothes and personal items to donate to the National Center for Children and Families. We also kicked-off a walking challenge to raise more than \$1,100 for regional charities, such as the Alzheimer's Foundation of America and CASA for Children of DC.

While we wrapped up an extraordinary year, we are also moving full steam ahead in 2020. It goes without saying that keeping the momentum and collaboration strong is paramount. Oh that, we leave you with a challenge.
